Any problems with your collection must be reported TO THE MORRIS COUNTY MUA before 10:00 am on the Monday morning following the collection day at the above phone number.

ALL OTHER RECYCLING QUESTIONS CALL CHATHAM TOWNSHIP AT 973-635-3207.

We encourage residents to put recyclables at curbside the night before, but they must be there BEFORE 6:00 am.

ALL-IN-ONE SINGLE STREAM RECYCLING IS HERE!

THIS MEANS PAPER AND BOTTLES AND CANS MAY NOW BE MIXED IN THE SAME CONTAINER. EVERYTHING MUST BE LOOSE, WHICH MEANS NO MORE TYING. CORRUGATED CARDBOARD BOXES MUST BE EMPTY AND FLAT. IF THEY ARE TOO BIG TO FIT IN YOUR CONTAINER, STACK THE FLATTENED BOXES INTO ONE UNFLATTENED BOX AND PLACE IT NEXT TO YOUR CONTAINER, ALONG WITH SINGLE-STREAM RECYCLING. MANY PACKAGING ITEMS WHICH HAD BEEN GARBAGE ARE NOW RECYCLABLE. THESE ITEMS ARE MARKED WITH AN ASTRISK *.

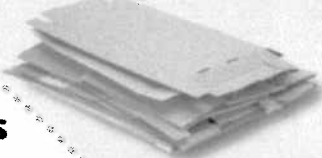

Follow Guidelines Carefully

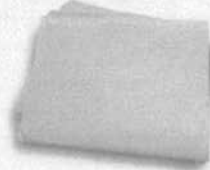
NO NEED TO REMOVE:

Paper clips, stamps, address labels, staples, metal fasteners, cellophane address windows, rubber bands, spiral bindings, plastic tabs

File folders & office paper



Paperboard boxes (cereal, pasta & tissue)



Not Acceptable

- Please flatten all cardboard boxes.
- Empty and rinse all containers.
- Don't shred more paper than necessary. Shred confidential information only.
- Collection container size is limited to 32 gallons (50 lbs). Use more than one container if necessary.

Glass bottles & jars



Junk mail, catalogs & magazines



- No scrap metal
- No VHS/VCR tapes
- No plastic bags
- No needles or syringes
- No window panes, mirrors, ceramics & Pyrex® dishware
- No stickers or address label sheet waste

Loose metal jar lids & steel bottle caps

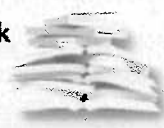


- No plastics other than those listed
- No electronic waste (batteries, cell phones, computers, etc.)
- No paint, pesticides, oil & cleansers
- No motor oil or antifreeze containers
- No organic material and food waste
- No waxed paper or waxed cardboard
- No Styrofoam™ or paper to-go containers
- No plastic caps
- No hard cover books

ADDITIONAL MANDATED RECYCLED MATERIALS FOR MORRIS COUNTY.



Appliances: *Composed predominantly of metal.* Picked up at curbside the 2nd Wednesday of the month by Chatham Disposal 973-379-1268. Freon must be removed by a licensed person and issued a sticker approving removal. For Freon removal: Morris Co. Appliance 973-538-4348, Dick & Sons 973-887-6200, Economy Appl. Service 973-635-5665, Ideal Refrigeration 973-539-0289, Par-Troy Sheet Metal & AC 973-428-1236. Refrigerator-Freezer Recycling Program: Call JACO Environmental for free removal of working appliance. Participants will receive a \$50 rebate. Call 1-877-270-3520 or visit www.NJCleanEnergy.com. For other bulk items call Chatham Disposal for information.

Batteries: Nickel Cadmium (Ni-Cd), Nickel Metal Hydride (Ni-MH), Lithium Ion (Li-Ion), Nickel Zinc (Ni-Zn), Small Sealed Lead (SSLA/Pb) are considered house hold hazardous waste. These types of batteries are commonly found in cellular & cordless phones, laptops, cameras, remote controls, toys and cordless tools. Places accepting these types of hazardous dry cell, rechargeable batteries: the Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006, Staples, Best Buy and Office Depot. **Note that Non-hazardous Dry Cell Batteries** (alkaline and carbon zinc dry cell AAA, AA, C, D, AND 9V non-rechargeable made after 1994) are no long considered hazardous. They may be thrown in the garbage.

Lead Acid Batteries (car, boats, campers, etc.): Contact the Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006 or www.mcmua.com for drop off sites..

Compost Material: Branches, brush, grass and leaves may be taken to the Tanglewood Lane Compost site. Call 973-377-5114 for information. No curbside pickup available.

Electronics: Computers, Monitors, TV's, Printers, Fax, etc. Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006. Check your local Staples 973-236-0800, Best Buy 973-515-4994, or Reconnect (Goodwill) 973-912-0156 for a list of what they recycle. www.chathamtownship.org/CTEC/recycling-reuse.html.

Carpets/Padding: Carpet Cycle 908-353-5900. Carpet and padding must be dry for pickup.

Cell Phones: Great Swamp Outdoor Center 973-635-6629, local supermarkets, Staples, Office Depot & Best Buy.

Christmas Trees: Drop off trees at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Center, when it is open, or check with your garbage hauler.

Construction Material: Tilcon 973-366-7741 Grinnell Recycling 973-383-9300 (Concrete & Asphalt Pavement),

Fluorescent Light Bulbs, Ballasts, Mercury Switches & Thermostats: Morris County Household Hazardous Waste Facility 973-829-8006. Home Depot will take fluorescent bulbs and CFL's.

Foam Packing, Peanuts: Foam Pack Industries, Springfield 973-376-3700.

Household Hazardous Waste Material: Call 973-829-8006 for disposal instructions or visit www.mcmua.com

Ink Printer/Toner Cartridges: Township is no longer accepting these. Places that do: Staples, Office Depot, Best Buy & Cartridge World. Most Chatham Public schools also accept - call school district Main Office 973-457-2500.

Large Rigid Plastics – Can only be dropped off at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot. For information of acceptable items go to www.chathamtownship.org. "Single Stream Recycling Is Here."

Latex Paint: For partially full can add Kitty litter, stir and let dry completely. Put in regular trash with lid off. If the can is full pour excess in another can and follow the preceding instructions.

Used Clothing – Market Street Mission and Amvets collection boxes are at the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot. All clothing must be placed in plastic bags or the items will be discarded.

If it's **snowing**, your recyclables may not be picked up on the scheduled day. Either put them out at curbside on the next collection day or take them to the Tanglewood Lane Recycling Depot.

If it's a **windy day**, put lids or heavier materials on top of the containers to prevent lighter materials from blowing away.

If it's **raining**, cover the containers with a lid. Also put **drain holes** in the bottom of container.

If your **trash and recyclables are collected on the same day or you use lids**, it's imperative that you label all containers properly to avoid confusion. **Decals** for trash and recycling containers are available at the public works department and at the municipal building. There is no cost for the decals.

Containers must have handles and be no larger than 32 gallons. Maximum weight for any container is 50 lbs.
Heavier than that will not be picked up.
